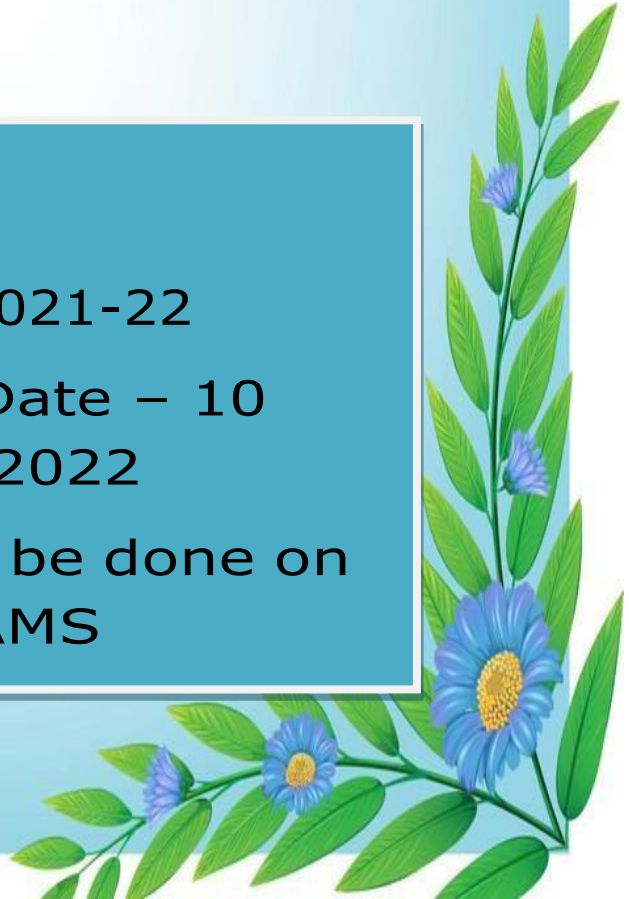

ENGLISH :

1-Simile is a figure of speech involving the comparison of one thing with another thing of a different kind, used to make a description more emphatic or vivid (e.g. as brave as a lion).

In the story ' Happy Prince', author Oscar Wilde has used colour similes like - ' **his lips are red as a pomegranate** ' and ' **the sapphire shall be as blue as the great sea.** '

Here are some more examples:

i) as white as a sheet (when someone's s face is white due to fear)

ii) As red as a beetroot (when someone's face is red due to embarrassment)

a) Select a colour and make as many similes as you can with it.

b) Using the colour similes and your imagination, create a short colour poem.
